Required Disclosure: Impact of Drug Conviction on Federal Aid (Title IV) Eligibility

Please be advised that under federal law, a recipient of Federal Aid (Title IV) aid who is convicted for possession and/or sale of illegal drugs while enrolled as a student at Hackensack Meridian School of Medicine will be ineligible for further Title IV funds for a fixed period of time, as indicated below.

	Possession of Illegal Drugs	Sale of Illegal Drugs
1st Offense	1 Year from the Date of Conviction	2 Years from the Date of Conviction
2nd Offense	2 Years from the Date of Conviction	Indefinite Period
3rd or More Offense	Indefinite Period	

** If convicted of both possession and selling illegal drugs, and the periods of ineligibility are different, the student will be ineligible for the longer period.*

A student regains eligibility the day after the period of ineligibility ends or when the student successfully completes a qualified drug rehabilitation program. The student will lose eligibility again upon a subsequent drug conviction.
